Key Changes following Government advice

On 21st February 2022, the next phase of the government's Covid-19 response was set and this risk assessment reflects the new advice and practices.

The main messages are:

1. Update to on site LTF testing. No longer advised in main stream settings, however, alternative provision and other specialist providers to continue twice weekly LTF testing.
2. If the number of positive cases substantially increases, to seek advice from public health and follow any advice or additional measures they recommend.

3. Update to on site LTF testing. No longer advised in main stream settings, however, alternative provision and other specialist providers to continue twice weekly LTF testing.
4. If the number of positive cases substantially increases, to seek advice from public health and follow any advice or additional measures they recommend.
5. Face coverings are no longer advised for pupils, staff and visits in classrooms and communal areas.
6. Public health advice for people with Covid-19 and their contacts changed from 24th February and contacts are longer required to self-isolate or advised to take daily tests. Contact tracing has ended. [People with COVID-19 and their contacts](#)
7. If staff or pupil who have Covid-19 symptoms should follow guidance on [People with COVID-19 and their contacts](#) and public health advice on [when to self-isolate and what to do](#). BAPA has taken the decision to protect other pupils and staff from possible infection from Covid-19 and staff or pupils should **NOT** attend site and follow the guidance below:
 - If you have Covid-19, you should stay at home while you're infectious to others.
 - This can be up to 10 days from when your symptoms start. Many people will no longer be infectious to others after 5 days
 - On day 5, repeat a rapid lateral flow tests and again on day 6:
 - If both tests are negative and you do not have a high temperature, you can return to normal attendance at school/work
 - If test result on day 5 is positive, to continue to do rapid lateral flow tests every day until 2 negative test results in a row.
